

## CIPR Professional Diploma in Public Relations – Instalment Plan

If you are paying your own tuition fees, you have the option to pay by instalment. There is no extra charge for paying by instalment.

Total course price when paying by instalment: **£2,595 (VAT included)**

The course price is made up of the tuition fee plus the CIPR registration fee and awarding body fee which PR Academy collects on the CIPR's behalf. Breakdown:

- 1) PR Academy tuition fee: £1275 plus VAT
- 2) CIPR awarding body fee: £990 VAT exempt (£320 per unit/assignment)
- 3) CIPR registration fee: £75 VAT exempt

Information about CIPR fees:

- The **awarding body assessment fee** is for the purpose of entering candidates for an assignment and this is done by updating the student record that was created on registration. This allows the awarding body (AB) to communicate essential assignment information to the candidate, track progress, issue confirmed grade(s) and eventually a certificate on successful completion. The awarding body is responsible for quality assurance and must have processes in place which are essentially tools for evaluating quality of teaching and student work, this process is applied by the CIPR Awarding Body Board of Examiners. Also, there is a formal teaching

centre accreditation process and criteria for this set by the AB. These are examples of awarding body running costs and are factored into the assessment fees charged.

- The **registration fee** is for the purpose of recognising that an individual is undertaking a CIPR qualification and the fee covers the associated expenses for creating a student record on the CIPR database. Personal details are stored securely in line with DPA policy and these personal details are used to communicate essential information concerning the CIPR qualification a candidate has enrolled to study as well as other relevant CIPR products and services to support candidates in their careers.
